- This is a writing competition not a mixed media art competition no entries to contain glitter, puff paint, oil pastels, lift the flap/3D effects or origami.
- Maximum paper size is A3

JUDGING CRITERIA

- accuracy and use of Language at the appropriate level
- adherence to rules
- originality not copies of commercial material (or previous years' materials)
- creativity
- quality of presentation & visual impact

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- 1. Entry is free and open to students in Grades 4 12 who study a Language on the Sunshine Coast.
- 2. **NOTE:** Teachers who enter students in the competition MUST be members of LTQ.
- 3. The entry is to be verified by the teacher of the language class, certifying that the entry is the original work of the student.
- 4. If handwritten entries are submitted, the **entry form** must be attached to the student's work (no paper clips). Please ensure all sections are completed. The competition convenors or judges cannot take responsibility for incomplete or incorrectly completed entry forms.
- **5.** Digital entries do not require entry forms attached but file names must adhere to the conventions explained below, or prizes will not be awarded.

Digital entries file name format should be as follows: SchoolName_Language_YearLevel_Category_Student_Name.pdf Eg:BuderimSS_Japanese_Year6_Digital_Jane_Doe.pdf

Handwritten entries can be scanned as submitted as a PDF file Eg:SCGS French Year10 Handwritten John Doe.pdf

- 6. Each entry must be the work of **ONE student** only.
- 7. Entries must be written in the modern language which is currently being studied by the entrant. When entries are judged, the number of years the student has been learning the language will be taken into account.
- 8. Entries will be judged on use of language appropriate to the number of years of study, quality of presentation, visual impact, creativity and originality. Entries should not be copies of commercial material or previous years' entries.
- 9. Judges' decisions will be final and no correspondence will entered into. Entries by native speakers may be reclassified at the discretion of the judges and/or competition convenor. Digital entries without the specified file name will not be judged.
- 10. The LTQ Sunshine Coast Branch reserves the right to withhold and/or reallocate awards if there are insufficient entries in any category or if the quality of entries is insufficient.
- 11. First, Second, Third and Highly Commended certificates may be awarded in all Year Level categories at the discretion of the judges.
- 12. Entries remain the property of the LTQ Sunshine Coast Branch. The LTQ Sunshine Coast branch will take all possible care with entries, but will not accept responsibility for any entries which become lost or damaged. The LTQ Sunshine Coast branch reserves the right to use any or all entries at a later date. Physical copies of student work will not be returned. Students and teachers are encouraged to copy entries BEFORE submission.
- 13. Teachers can enter one entry, per class, in each category. (eg; if your primary school has 3 classes of Year 5 French, you can submit three entries for Year 5 French).
